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### **Update your Fishing Dates!**

We are excited to offer an additional option for submitting your 2021 fishing and/or berry picking dates. We have created a form within CampBrain that allows you to submit this information to us electronically and directly.

Updating your fishing dates each year ensures that your children remain eligible so there is no disruption in the services they can receive from Migrant Education. As a reminder, all fishing trips must include overnights away from your home and must take place outside of ASD's district boundaries (Chugiak to Girdwood). Any berry picking trips reported must also include overnights and the picking must take place on land you do not own.

Please remember that updating your Certificate of Eligibility is a multi-step process and that requires your signature and final approval from Juneau, but letting us know that you went fishing by submitting your dates through this system to us is a great way to get started!

Note: When you select a person to register on the next page, please ONLY REGISTER ONE PERSON from your household (preferably yourself) so you only have to complete the form one time. You will enter the children that traveled with you ON THE FORM.

were via Zoom and in-person instruction. In June 159 students earned credit in 279 classes and in July we had 59 students earn credit in 90 classes. # Summer Programming Highlights

#### 2021 Middle School Summer Intensives

MEP hosted 2 intensives for middle school students this past July (biking and hunter safety). 20 MEP students explored the Anchorage biking trail system during a two day biking intensive. Students learned about the different types of biking, biking basics and etiquette. Students rode over 30 miles daily!

13 students participated in a week long hunter's safety course with the AK Department of Fish and Game that concluded with a qualifying field test at the Rabbit Creek Range. Both intensives were reviewed by ASD's Risk Management and all safety precautions were taken to keep everyone safe!
