School Business Partnerships

What is School Business Partnership (SBP)?

The School Business Partnership program connect businesses and community organizations to support local schools. Partnerships enhance the student experience, support community citizenship and provide more knowledgeable, skilled future employees and consumers. The partnerships build bridges of understanding and positive working relationships between the business and education community.

Each partnership is formed by developing expectations for the relationship between the Principal (or coordinator) of the school and the business representative, identifying how the school and business are going to interact in building a successful relationship.

Who can participate?

School Business Partnerships are formal entities, legal to do business with youth and adults and authorized to operate within the Municipality of Anchorage and State of Alaska. Businesses may be nonprofit, private corporations, governmental or sole proprietor. Organizations are willing and able to partner with a school, department or the school district and offer programs or services at no cost to the District or its schools.

What is required of my company in a partnership?

Having a successful partnership program takes time, commitment and effort. The organization should be interested in building a relationship with the partner school. Schools and businesses with successful partnerships have built trust and managed expectations by developing long-term projects in ways to positively build their Partnership.

Organizations should identify a primary point of contact and determine organizations level of commitment.
