Elementary summer school is not being offered this year.

Middle School Summer Academy will be focused on building successful student behaviors and routines while strengthening foundational skills in core academic areas. Students will attend four classes daily: reading, writing, math, and PE. Middle School Academy sites are Begich Middle School, Hanshew Middle School, and Chugiak High School. Classes will be held Monday-Friday from May 31 through June 29th at those locations. Cost is \$100. More details are included on the registration/info form. Migrant Education/ Child in Transition will provide summer school for eligible Migrant Education and CIT/H students. Classes are held at East High School beginning June 1 and ending June 29, 2016. In addition, third session class from 3 pm – 5:30 pm for students who need the additional credit is also offered. Funding is provided by the CIT and Migrant Education budget. Approximately 100 students participate in this program, and several seniors typically graduate at the end of summer school.

Special Education ESY will run June 7th – July 28th Tuesday –Thursday with AM and PM sessions between 8:30am-3:30pm at Russian Jack Elementary and Trust Authority Building for secondary students. Whaley, Mt. Iliamna, and School-Based Behavior Supports (SBBS) students will attend at Whaley School. Funding is provided by the Special Education department. Approximately 400 students will be participating in this program.
