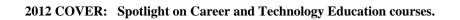

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I. Introduction and Overview of CIP Document

The Anchorage School Board is responsible for providing an adequate educational environment for the students of Anchorage. To fulfill this obligation, the school board regularly engages in comprehensive long-range planning of school facility construction, renovation, and maintenance. On an annual basis, the school board adopts a Capital Improvement Plan that addresses the anticipated levels of student enrollment and shifts in enrollment, along with school facility condition and functionality from an educational perspective. Typically, this plan delineates the district's construction priorities over the succeeding six-year period. Starting in 2007-08 the plan covered the succeeding 10-year period. The 2011-12 CIP is returning to the six year plan.

The steps in preparing the Six-Year CIP are listed below:

- 1. Survey all Anchorage area private schools for membership data.
- 2. Collect birth data from the State of Alaska Bureau of Vital Statistics and population data from the State demographer.
- 3. Determine total military membership residing on and off military installations from the ASD's Information Technology Department.
- 4. Survey all district principals to determine school space utilization.
- 5. Input six-year membership forecasts into computer spreadsheets, which generate student projection tables.
- 6. Receive administrative recommendations for alleviating negative conditions projected in facility usage based on the six-year forecast.
- 7. Obtain approved recommendations from the district's Capital Improvement Advisory Committee.
- 8. School board review and approval of the CIP.
- 9. Present board approved CIP to the Municipal Planning and Zoning Commission for comments.
- 10. Transmittal of CIP to Anchorage Assembly and to the State Department of Education and Early Development (EED).

II. School Facilities and Educational Structure

The Anchorage School District operates and maintains the largest physical plant of any public entity in the state, with approximately 7.5 million square feet of facilities. The replacement value of district buildings exceeds \$2 billion. The district has 93 facilities, comprised of eighty-seven schools and 6 support facilities. In addition, there are sixteen alternative and charter school programs. The district houses more than 48,000 students and over 6,500 staff members.

Forty-four elementary schools are organized K-6, while Chester Valley, Chugiak, Creekside Park, Fire Lake, Mountain View, Muldoon, Nunaka Valley, Ptarmigan, Russian Jack, Scenic Park, Susitna, Tyson, Williwaw, and Wonder Park elementary schools are organized K-5. Aurora, Mt. Spurr, and Orion elementary schools are located on Elmendorf Air Force Base. Ursa Major and Ursa Minor elementary schools are located on Fort Richardson Army Post. Due to a decline in enrollment on Fort Richardson, Kennedy Elementary School was closed at the end of the 1999-2000 school year, and is being used by the district's Information Technology Department. Two elementary schools have a K-8 organizational pattern: Northern Lights ABC and Girdwood K-8 School.

Central, Goldenview, Gruening, Hanshew, Mears, Romig and Wendler middle schools are organized for grades 7–8. Begich, Clark, and Mirror Lake middle schools are organized for grades 6-8. Bartlett, Chugiak, Dimond, Eagle River, East, Service, South and West senior high schools are organized for grades 9–12.

Polaris K-12 School, an alternative elementary/secondary program, is organized for grades K-12. Continuation, Crossroads, and Steller Alternative secondary programs are organized 7–12. Two other alternative secondary programs are organized 9–12: AVAIL and Benny Benson. AVAIL is housed at the Fifth Avenue Mall; Benny Benson is housed at the ASD Benny Benson building, while Crossroads is housed at the Success by Six building in Mountain View. SEARCH, an alternative secondary program that is organized for grades 7-8, is also housed at the Benny Benson building. SAVE, another alternative secondary program, is organized 10-12 and is housed in its own facility. ASD's Continuation School, serving students in grades 7-12, is housed in mall space on International Airport Road; Creating Optimal High

School Opportunities (COHO), an alternative secondary program that is organized 9-12, is housed at Chugiak High School.

In the 1997-98 school year, three charter schools became part of the ASD: Aquarian (K-6), Family Partnership (K-12), and Walden Pond (K-6). In 1998-99, Village Charter School (K-8) began operations. Due to enrollment problems, Walden Pond closed in December 2000 and Village closed in December 2004. In 2003-04, two charter schools opened their doors, Highland Tech (6-12) and Frontier (K-12). Two additional K-6 charter schools opened in 2005-06: Eagle Academy and Winterberry—currently K-8. Rilke Schule (K-8) began operation in 2007-08. In 2008-09, the Alaska Native Culture Charter School (K-6) began operation.

Special Education services are offered in all elementary and secondary schools in the district. Two school facilities, Mt. Iliamna on JBER Elmendorf and Whaley School, are dedicated to serving students with significant disabilities.

In addition, the district operates three state contract programs: Alaska State School for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, Providence Heights, and McLaughlin School. The district also operates special educational programs for students in five residential facilities: Jesse Lee Home, Booth Memorial, McKinley Heights, Charter North Hospital and North Star Hospital.

Elementary schools feed into middle schools and middle schools feed into high schools. Although it is always a goal of boundary setting to place a feeder school within the boundary of only one higher level school (i.e., elementary to middle school or middle school to high school), this is not always possible. In 2006-07, middle schools underwent an extensive boundary study to incorporate Begich and to better align middle school boundaries with high schools. The boundaries took effect in the 2007-08 school year. The following listing shows those middle and area-wide schools that are located within each high school attendance area. It also includes the percentage of the Middle and area-wide school's enrollment that lives in the boundary of that high school (if there are split boundaries).

III. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT NEEDS AND GOALS

The Anchorage School District operates and maintains the largest physical plant of any public entity in the state. These facilities consist of approximately 7.7 million square feet in eighty-seven schools and six support sites. Not only is the District's inventory of facilities large, it is also aging. Fifty three schools are over 20 years old, and of these sixteen are over 50 years old.

To care for this substantial investment, the district has implemented an integrated facility management program (FMP).

A key component of this program is the capital planning and assessment management system (CPMS). The CPMS database centralizes information on facility components and system conditions and a facility's ability to meet current educational program requirements. This information is collected during facility and educational assessments, by utilizing systematic, consistent, and repeatable methodologies to obtain the initial information and for ongoing efforts to maintain the long term usefulness of the information. The collected information serves as a basis to determine capital needs, priorities, educational inadequacies, facility capital costs and in developing short and long term facility planning and funding strategies.

Educational program requirements are defined by districtwide educational specifications for elementary, middle and high school levels. Educational adequacy assessments determine the ability of a school to meet educational program requirements by evaluating the quantity, configuration, size, and existence of spaces defined by educational specifications. For example, a school may not have enough classrooms to offer health classes, or a gymnasium in addition to a multi-purpose room in order to allow for concurrent lunches and physical activity.

Currently, facility condition assessments are complete for 39 schools and educational program assessments are complete for 35 schools. The remaining sites will be assessed by fall 2013.

Information collected from facility condition and educational program assessments highlight the following key factors of the District's building inventory.

Building components wear out. Facility systems only last so long. Roofs deteriorate and leak; heating, plumbing, and ventilation systems wear out; and structural systems age. Various code changes require updating electrical and mechanical systems, access for persons with physical disabilities; removing hazardous materials, and renewing various building system components. Moreover, significant renewals often require structural upgrades to meet more stringent seismic codes.

Functional obsolescence is another fact of life for older schools. Over the life of a school, programmatic changes take place that demand updating the facility infrastructure. There is a continual need to update the electrical distribution systems in the schools to accommodate current technology. Current educational delivery methods require physical layouts that are often different and more flexible than those of 30 to 40 years ago. Without renewal, these schools do not provide ASD students the same educational opportunities through parity of program and facilities across the school system.

Additional capacity to house the constantly shifting student population is the third component of capital requirements. Anchorage is the largest district in the state, and while its overall enrollment has been steady in recent years, the geographic distribution of students continues to shift due to the high mobility of the Anchorage population. The district has over 130 relocatable classrooms available to meet short-term capacity needs in affected schools.

Capital Improvement Goals

The following goals guide decision-making with respect to school facilities in ASD:

- 1. To make maximum use of existing school and support facilities.
- 2. To provide the necessary facilities for programs that supports the standard school.
- 3. To close and rededicate, or dispose of, existing schools and support facilities where necessitated by significant declines in student membership, building deterioration beyond feasible upgrade or repair, program adjustments or municipal and state codes.

- 4. To reduce the level of dependency on temporary building facilities (relocatables) whenever possible.
- 5. To construct or purchase school buildings and support facilities in order to achieve a reduction in leased facilities wherever practical.
- 6. To maintain the school board approved organizational plan of grades K-6, 7-8 and 9-12. Exceptions to this goal are the following board approved programs: Girdwood K-8 School, Northern Lights ABC School K-8, Polaris K-12 School, Steller Secondary 7-12, Mirror Lake Middle School 6-8, Begich Middle School 6-8, and Clark Middle School 6-8. As facilities allow, 6-7-8 grade configurations for middle schools are preferred.
- 7. To adjust school boundaries wherever such adjustments are deemed as promoting the optimal utilization of school facilities, a reduction in transportation costs or the development of contiguous boundaries for "feeder" schools.
- 8. To review the Capital Improvement Program with appropriate municipal departments prior to its annual submittal to the Anchorage Assembly.
- 9. To design and construct traffic safety improvements that implement municipal land use and transportation goals and policies by
 - a. Promoting the convenience and safety of student, pedestrian, and bike travel
 - b. Retaining school open space and recreation areas to meet current and future community recreation needs as identified in adopted plans
- 10. Consider improvements that promote energy conservation.

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IV. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT RECOMMENDATIONS: 2012-13 to 2017-18

The Board and Administration continue to evaluate needs for 21st century education at the middle and high school level, and vocation-technical education generally. Career and Technology educational projects are shown in the first two years of this Capital Improvement Plan which focus' on enhancing current space in the middle and high schools.

Table 1 summarizes the recommended six-year capital improvement projects and their estimated cost. Table 2 provides brief descriptions for the projects shown in Table 1. Table 3 shows the agency interface required for undeveloped sites currently managed by the District. Initial project cost estimates are based on Fiscal Year 2012 costs with inflation adjustments for years two through six of the plan. Adjustment to these cost estimates will be made in future years due to fluctuations in construction costs and scope of work identified in the initial planning or design stages of the projects. In addition to the projects included in this CIP, the district also allocates general funds every year for Maintenance and maintenance projects, which is approximately \$21,750,000 for FY 2012-2013.

Definitions:

Replacement (**REP**) – Total or partial replacement of the building structure to meet educational program requirements and replacement of building systems that have exceeded their life expectancy.

Addition/Renovation (A/R) – Major renovation of existing building to address aging building systems and significant education program deficiencies. Additional square footage will be added to existing building to address educational program and/or capacity issues.

Major Renovation (REN) – Major renovation of existing building to address aging building systems and significant education program deficiencies.

Component Renewal (**CR**) – Replacement of or upgrades to more than one major building systems that have exceeded their expected life cycle.

Building Life Extension (BLE) – Replacement of or upgrade to single building system. These projects are normally grouped together under specific district wide categories.

Career and Technology Education (CTE) – Improvements of instructional space to support career and technology educational program delivery at a school.

Program Improvement (PI) – Improvement of instructional space to support educational program delivery. These projects require facility upgrades that may require component renewal, renovation, and/or addition.

V. <u>Historical Population Growth Factors And Administrative Policies</u> <u>Affecting School Enrollment</u>

Residential Births in Anchorage: While the number of births in Anchorage has not always proven to be a reliable predictor of kindergarten membership, the information does provide an indication of future long-range trends. The movement of families in and out of the municipality, as well as the number of births per household, affects the value of this data. Table 4 presents data on residential births occurring in Anchorage since 1980. While ASD Demographics observes all birth patterns, its focus is Births Adjusted to School Year. Since 1993, the numbers of births in Anchorage began a decline. Births went from a high of 4,900 to a low of 4,200. The first real increase in the number of births in Anchorage since the early 1990s was in 2004, with 153 additional births. The 2009 estimate of 4,803 is the first time the numbers have reached the highs of the early-90's. It is projected that overall birth trends will continue to increase, as will the corresponding kindergarten enrollment.

School-Age Children in Total Population: Historically, school membership levels in Anchorage have reflected the city's population growth, which was highly influenced by migration. Since 2001 the population in Anchorage has increased by 12 percent, primarily through natural increase. During the same period of time, school membership slightly decreased due to the aging population. This year there was a 0.1% decrease (263 students) in membership over 2010-11. Current school membership represents 16 percent of the Anchorage population, down approximately 3 percentage points from early-2000 levels. However, it is important to note that both the addition of mandated and community-desired school programs, more students with special needs, as well as major shifts in the residential location of the student population, have substantially affected space requirements in many district facilities. Table 5 lists Anchorage population and school membership for the years 1998-99 through 2011-12. It also includes the military student population on-base and off-base for the same period. The number of military students has increased by over 600 students (13 percent) from 2001-02 to 2011-12.

Monthly Public School Membership: Table 6 summarizes end-of-the-month school membership from 1979-80 to 2011-12.

Grade Level Membership: Analyzing the historical grade level membership in Table 7 indicates certain trends in school membership. For example, the kindergarten membership averaged 3,801 students during the 1990s. That average declined to 3,543 from 2000 to 2003. However, for the last five years the average kindergarten enrollment has increased to 3,743.

These kindergarten enrollment patterns have a ripple effect through the higher grade levels. From 2002 to 2007, grade levels 7-12 benefited from the large kindergarten classes of the 1990s. These numbers peaked in 2005 with a membership of 22,925 and then decreased to 21,420 in 2011. Enrollment numbers are expected to continue to decline slightly in the near future as a result of the smaller entering (kindergarten) classes of the 2000s.

Tables 7A-7E provide details of the summary in Table 7, by school and by grade within each school.

Geographic Attendance Area Membership: Tables 8 and 9 present historical elementary and secondary membership broken down by geographic area. In prior years these tables have referenced high school attendance areas. The tables in this report are based on the same groupings of feeder schools as prior years, to allow historical comparison. However, since there is not a one-to-one relationship between feeder schools and next higher level of schools, it is more appropriate to refer to geographic areas, rather than high school attendance areas. This information provides basic data for analyzing shifts in student population. Table 10 provides information on ASD special services programs membership.

Non-Public School Membership: Data on private school membership has historically been collected by the district. Table 11 summarizes this data for the years 2002-2003 to 2011-12. Table 12 lists the individual schools and their 2011-12 memberships.

Attendance Zones and Boundary Exceptions: School board policies and procedures permit students to attend a school or program outside their regular attendance area, provided classroom space is available. When there are no openings for a school or program, a lottery is conducted and a waiting list is developed. Students on the waiting list are admitted in sequence as openings

occur. Transfer requests are to be monitored to ensure that such transfers do not result in crowding of facilities or racially isolated school populations.

Boundary Adjustments: Changes to attendance boundaries are normally required as a result of opening a new school or shifts in student population. The factors listed below serve as a guide for boundary adjustment recommendations:

- 1. The geographic proximity. The maintenance of the area or neighborhood school concept where feasible. Non-contiguous boundaries are contrary to school board policy and district planning objectives.
- The transportation of students. Any redistricting should attempt to minimize travel time for students and overall transportation costs, as well as minimize hazardous conditions for students walking to school.
- 3. The development of a "feeder" school network in which elementary school boundaries do not overlap those of middle schools and senior high schools; and middle school boundaries do not overlap those of senior high schools.
- 4. The retention of a reasonably balanced racial ethnic membership in all schools.
- 5. The relationship of boundary adjustments to historical student assignment changes. Efforts are made to avoid reassignment of students who have been affected by an earlier boundary change.
- 6. The maintenance of a commitment to long-range planning decisions.

VI. Membership Projections Summary: 2012-13 to 2017-18

Forecasting Methodology and Assumptions: The principal methodology used to project the 2012-13 through 2017-18 enrollment is known as the cohort-survival technique. The basic technique involves calculating the ratio of the number of students in one grade during one year compared to the number of students who "survive" the year and enroll in the next grade in the following year. This survival rate calculation treats the student body in an aggregate fashion, using historical membership data. It is affected by such factors as school promotion, net migration and withdrawal rates. All of these factors are included in the term "survival" as it is used in this context.

Fluctuations in the data from year to year create a pattern from which an average survival rate can be calculated to project future student membership. For example, if over a period of several years an average of 96 percent of the student membership in grade three goes on to grade four, and if 300 children are now enrolled in grade three, then next year's grade four membership may be estimated at 96 percent of 300, or 288 students. Twelve average rates of survival are calculated for a system with thirteen grades (kindergarten is considered to be a grade). These rates can then be applied to present student membership and used to project membership levels for each succeeding year.

Projecting future kindergarten membership is more complex. Grade-to-grade cohort survival cannot be used, since there is no preceding grade for kindergarten. Therefore, information such as estimates of the number of children in the 1-5 year old population cohorts, the number of live births five years previously, and recent trends in kindergarten are utilized. This year's forecast for kindergarten enrollment was derived from historical kindergarten enrollment and historical births (adjusted for school year). These projections were used to determine kindergarten enrollment for the next six years. Indicators of housing and development trends were then incorporated into these projections.

Projections for individual schools are derived using the benchmark numbers realized through the cohort-survival and kindergarten projection methods. The allocation of students to each school is done by examining historical trends in

individual school membership, as well as historical and projected housing and economic trends for that area.

A good population forecast should be driven by assumptions. If the assumptions behind the forecast are considered reasonable and the methodology employed is professionally acceptable, the forecast will represent a credible attempt to estimate future ASD membership levels for planning purposes. The assumptions, which were employed in developing the 2012-13 to 2017-18 membership forecasts, are described below.

ASD projections contained in this document do not reflect the impact of any major events occurring in the next six years: construction of the natural gas pipeline, opening of ANWR for oil exploration, closure of military installations; major changes in the state's economic or political structure. It is assumed, however, that oil and mineral exploration will continue in Alaska throughout the decade, perhaps at a more rapid pace than in recent years. It is also assumed that industry in Anchorage will continue to develop and their employment levels will affect the ASD membership.

Economic, demographic, and housing data are utilized in the formulation of long-range student membership projections. Information supplied by the state demographer, MOA Department of Public Works, State Department of Labor (AKDOL), and the State Bureau of Vital Statistics, has been utilized in formulating the six-year student membership projections.

According to AKDOL, in 2009 the Anchorage economy lost jobs for the first time in 20-plus years. Those losses were likely the result of the national recession and its impact on Alaska. Every industry, except health care and government, lost jobs. Recent estimates indicate increasing gains in jobs were made in 2010 and 2011. However, declining oil production in combination with federal expenditure cuts are expected to limit job growth in 2012.

The Anchorage economy has seen a leveling in property valuation, increased housing supply, and low interest rates. With a 2011 year to date (January through December) average sale price of \$323,584 (AK MLS), home purchase is less affordable for some and continues to be a reason for out-migration to the

Matanuska-Susitna Borough. Anchorage lost 899 residents through net outmigration to Mat-Su during 2009-2010.

Although Anchorage is experiencing significant out-migration to Mat-Su, there has been some in-migration from the Lower 48, as well as some in-migration from rural Alaskan communities, lessening the overall net out-migration to 355 residents over 2010-2011 (AKDOL). Much of the in-migration over recent years has been an increase in the military population.

Recent population projections by the state demographer indicate that Anchorage will have an average annual net increase of 2,793 residents from 2009 to 2014. This increase will be the result of natural increase (births minus deaths) along with a negative net migration of -1,186 residents—possibly less net out-migration after comparing pre-census projections to 2010 Census results.

From 2000 to 2010, the child-rearing age cohort (15-44 year old females) increased 1.8 percent, and the population of the 0 - 4 age group increased 9.6 percent. For 2000 and 2010, the Anchorage birth rate was 66.3 and 72.1, respectively (AK DHSS).

The Census Bureau administers a one-, three-, and five-year community survey. Although the American Community Survey (ACS) produces population, demographic and housing unit estimates, it is the Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program that produces and disseminates the official estimates of the population for the nation, states, counties, cities and towns and estimates of housing units for states and counties.

The survey has been done for Anchorage since 2002. Because it is a survey, there are sampling and non-sampling errors associated with the data; therefore the data should be used with caution. The results of the 2008-2010 three year survey indicate: 9 percent of Anchorage residents are foreign born; 16 percent spoke another language at home—of these, 38 percent did not speak English very well; 8 percent were in poverty; 9 percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level.

The military student population has increased by 16.8 percent from 2006 to 2011. The military and dependent population is not expected to continue to increase at this rate with upcoming federal budget cuts.

This year, the official elementary school enrollment was 179 less students than last year. Last year there was an increase of 81 students over the 2009-10 school year. It is projected that increased elementary membership will be sustained through the six-year period by increased kindergarten enrollment.

Middle level enrollment was 102 students greater than in 2010-11. Next year, middle schools membership is projected to decrease by 71 students. As large elementary student numbers age into middle school, middle school is projected to continue to increase during the latter half of the six-year period.

High school enrollment was 268 students fewer than in 2010-11. It is estimated that high school enrollment will slightly decrease next year as well. Enrollment will then start to increase through the remainder of the six-year period as the larger elementary and middle school numbers move into this level.

This year charter school enrollment increased by 57 students over 2010-11. Last year that increase was 11 students. Charter schools are projected to increase throughout the six-year period.

Table 13 shows the districtwide membership projections for the next six years by grade. This table reflects slight increases over the six-year period. This increase comes mainly from the elementary levels, as discussed above.

Table 14 shows the elementary projections for each geographic area. These projections follow the same structure as former years, in terms of the elementary schools assigned to each area. However, rather than calling the areas "High School Attendance Area", this report labels them by geographic region. Prior reports have created some confusion, because of the terminology it appeared that all students from a particular elementary school would be going to a single high school. Some split boundaries do not allow for a one-to-one match from feeder schools. Since it is still useful to look at what has

happened to enrollments (Table 8), and what is projected to happen to enrollments in various parts of the district, Table 14 is maintained in this report by geographic region.

Table 15 summarizes the projections for each elementary school, and includes the Program Capacity and actual enrollment for September 30, 2011. Prior CIP documents have utilized EED capacities based on square foot allowance for each student as the basis for this capacity number. Program Capacity is based on classroom utilization and makes comparison of capacities between schools a more meaningful process. A summary of the program and EED capacities is provided in the appendix to this report.

Tables 16 and 17 provide the same information for middle school and high school memberships, respectively. Tables 18 and 19 summarize this information for the secondary districtwide schools, charter schools, alternative schools, and special services programs.

VII. Current Facilities Utilization

Program Capacity: The district has made the decision to report its individual school capacities on a program, rather than EED, basis. EED calculations are based primarily on the square footage of the facility and the grade level of students attending the school (elementary or secondary). Based on these calculations, the prototypical 26-classroom school, such as Kincaid, Russian Jack or Lake Hood, has a capacity of 536 students. The EED capacities are often quite different from the program capacities computed on a school-by-school basis, with the number of classrooms and their utilization being the determining factors. For example, the Program Capacity for Kincaid is 514, Russian Jack is 452, and Lake Hood is 489. This difference in capacities for schools that are basically identical in structure is due to the nature of the programs functioning at each of these schools, or the utilization.

Facilities Utilization: Administrators are aware that some programs, or special services, require space beyond the normal capacity of a classroom. Therefore, in this report, information is provided to assist the schools and administration in evaluating the actual number of students that can be housed, based on classroom utilization. Part of this information is summarized in Tables 20-22, which lists information on each school related to number of classrooms, square footage, and relocatable units in use. In Appendix A, in addition to a detailed projection for each school, there is information on the number and types of special programs and special space requirements for each school, as provided by staff of the individual units.

Schools Projected at Greater Than 120 Percent of Capacity: Table 23 lists the projected enrollment of all schools, for the next six years, as a percentage of capacity. Those schools at which the projected enrollment is greater than 120 percent for at least one of the six years projected are highlighted in bold print.

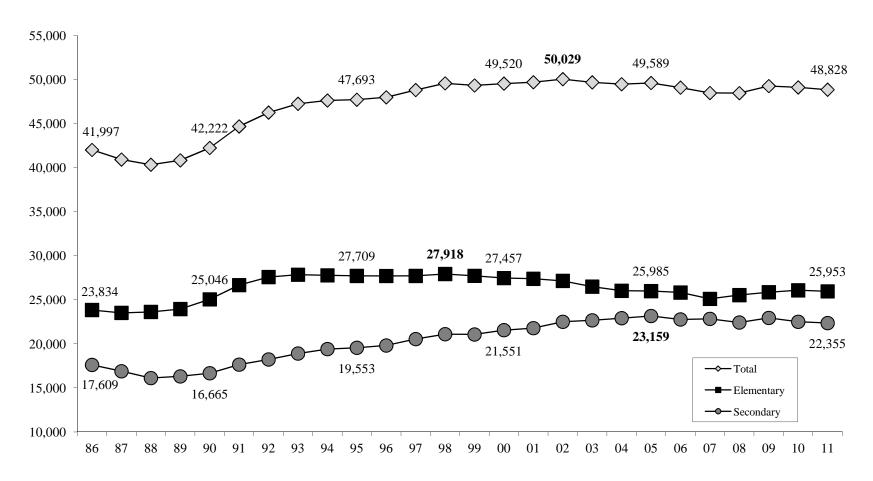

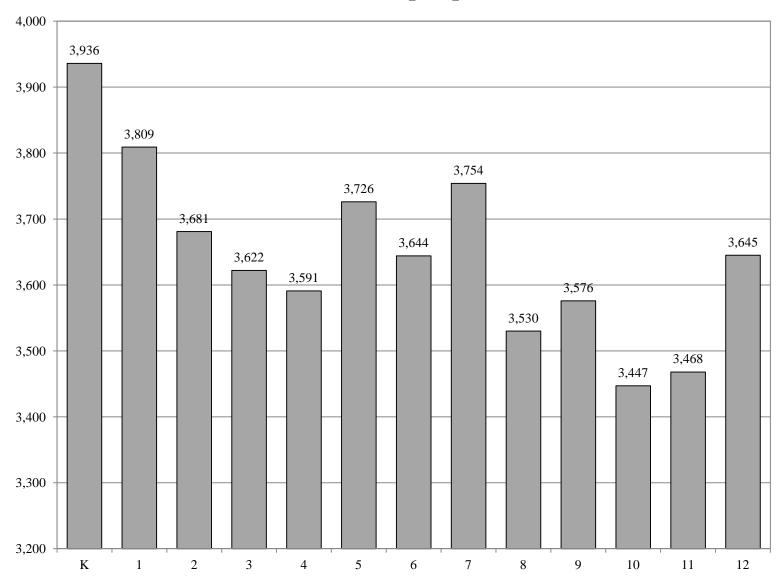

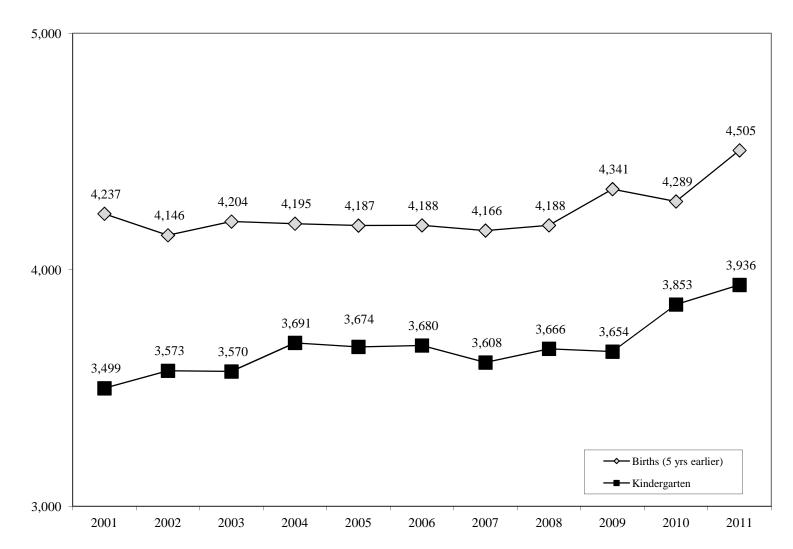
Grades K-12 Membership September 30, 2011

Ten Year History of Kindergarten Enrollment and Births (5 Years Earlier)

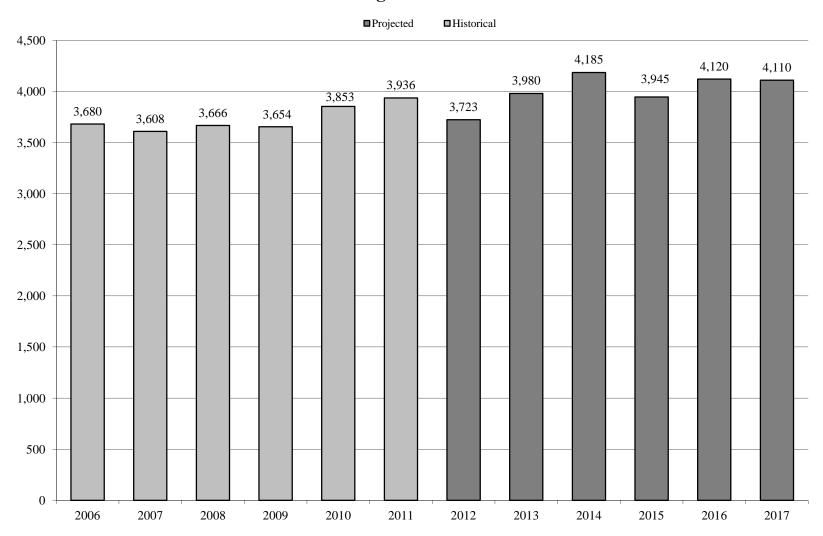

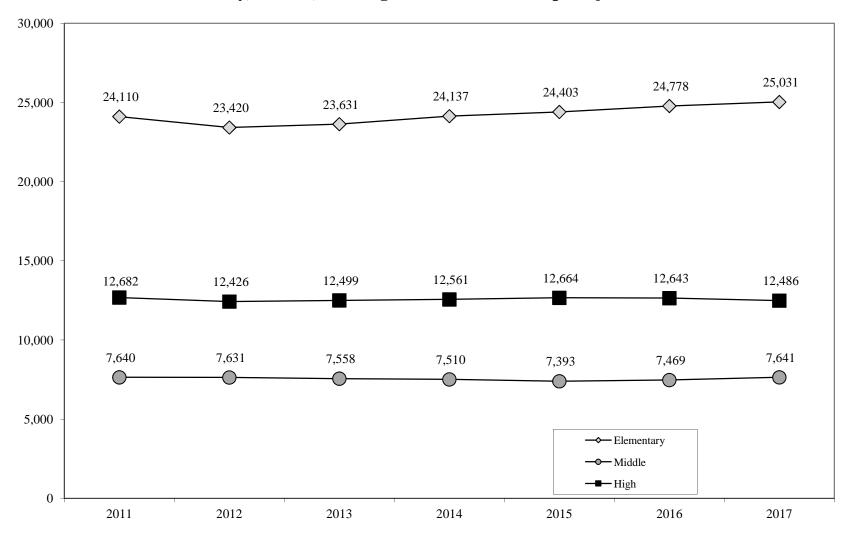
Kindergarten Enrollment

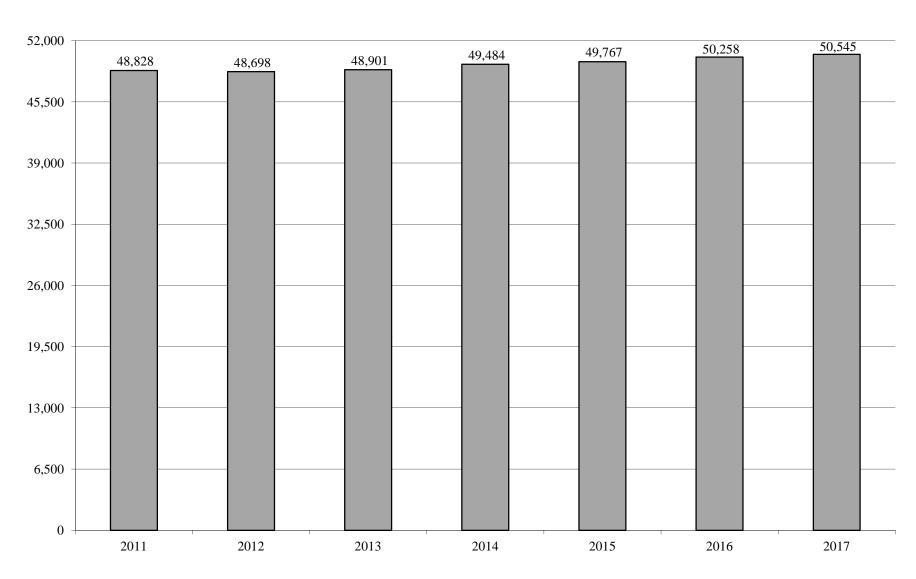

White and Non-White Membership History

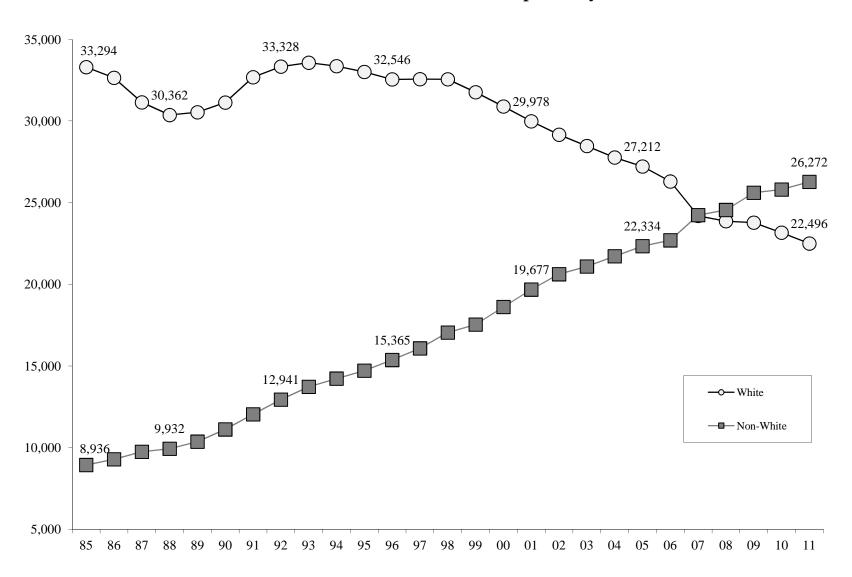
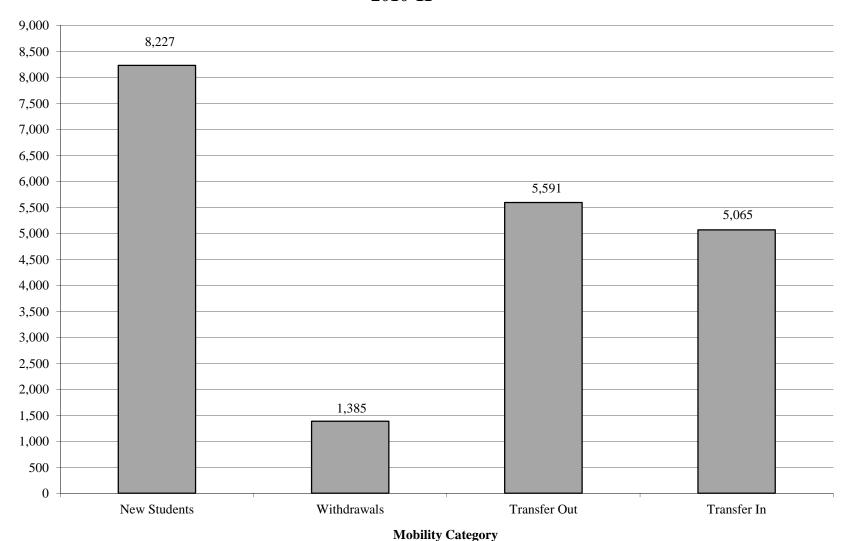
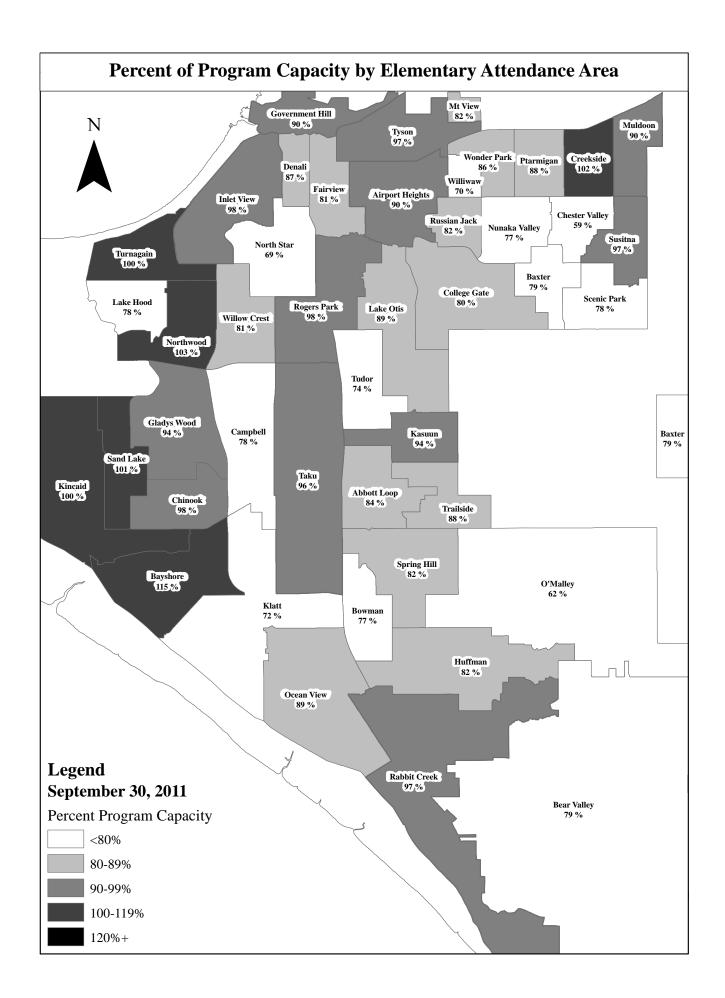
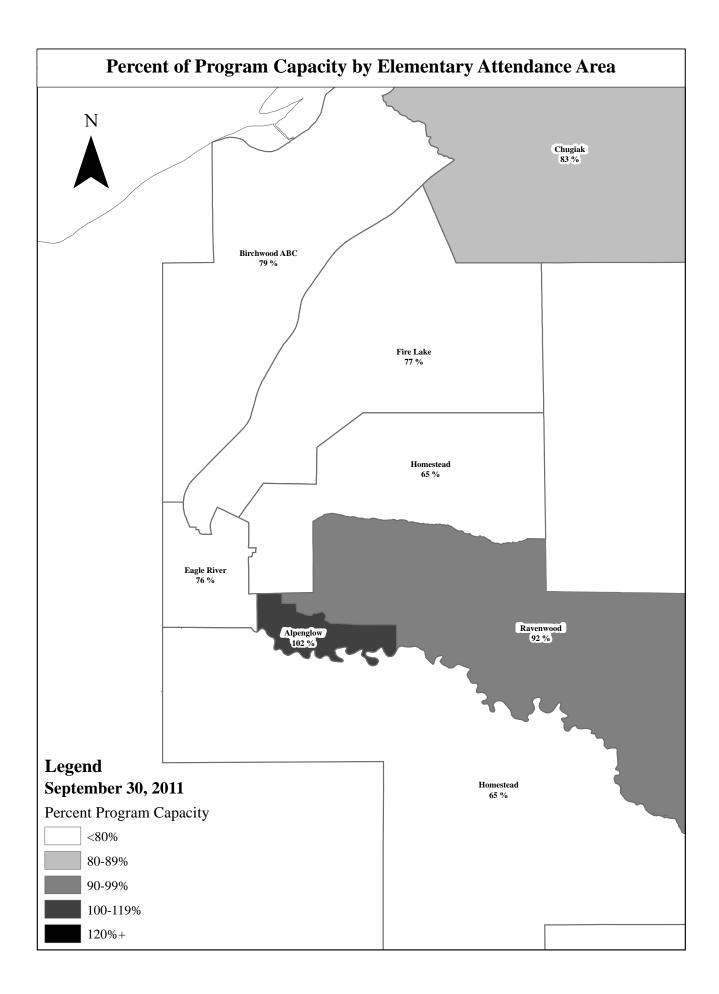


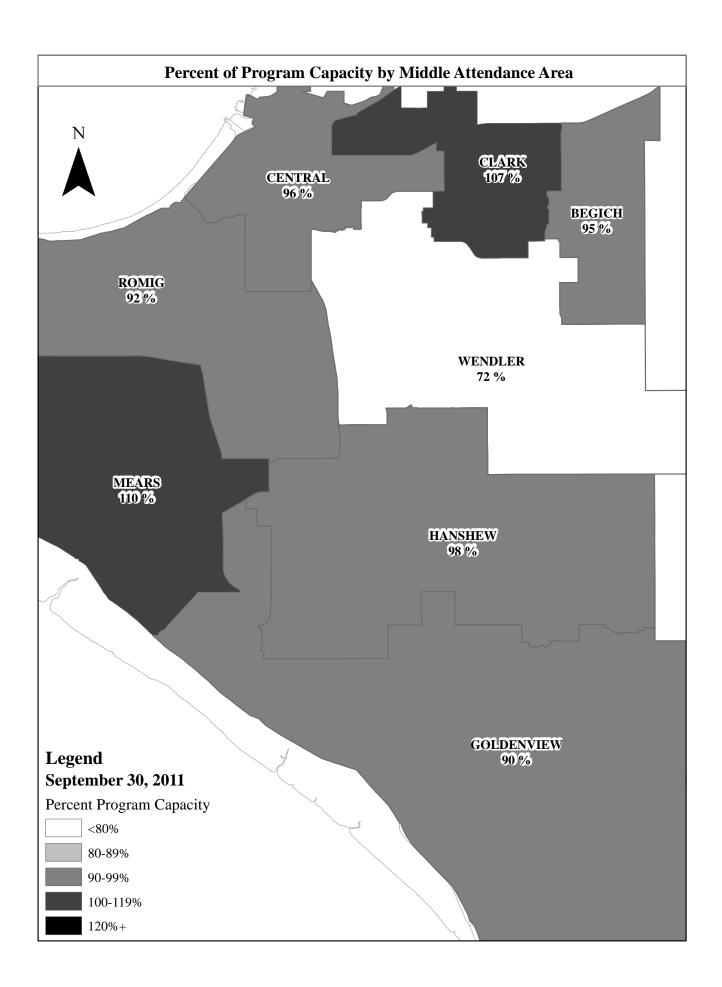

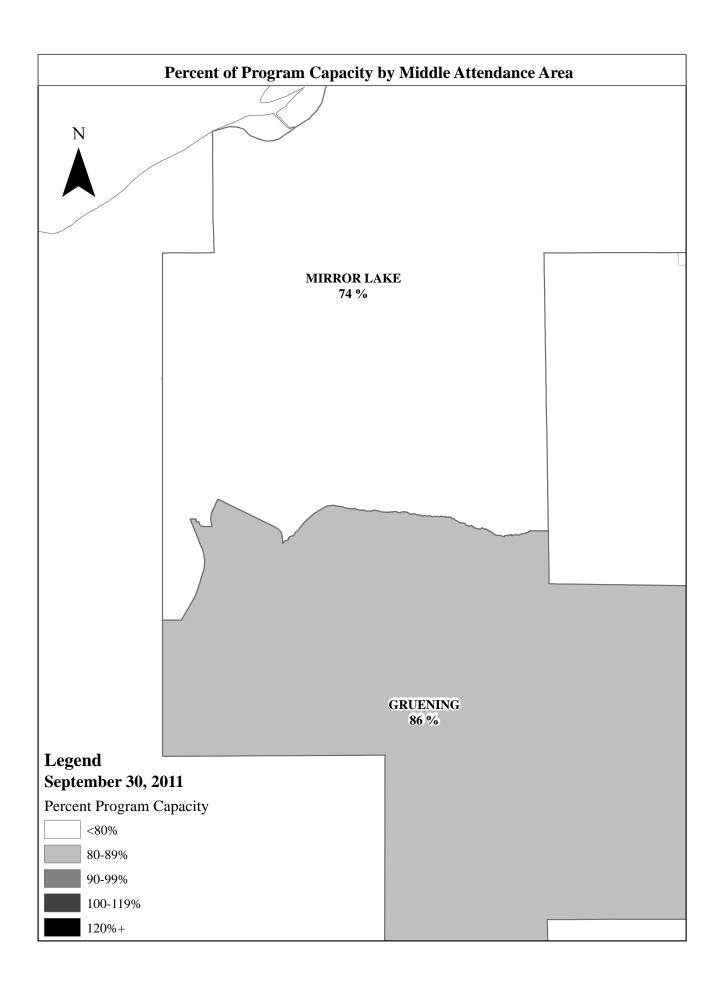
Student Mobility 2010-11

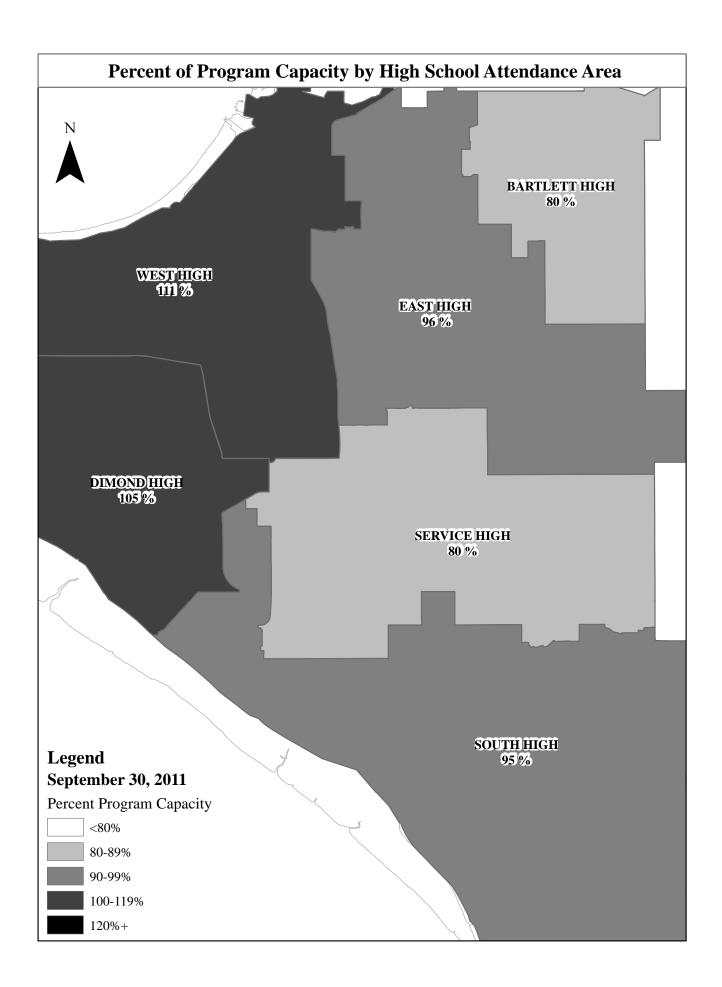


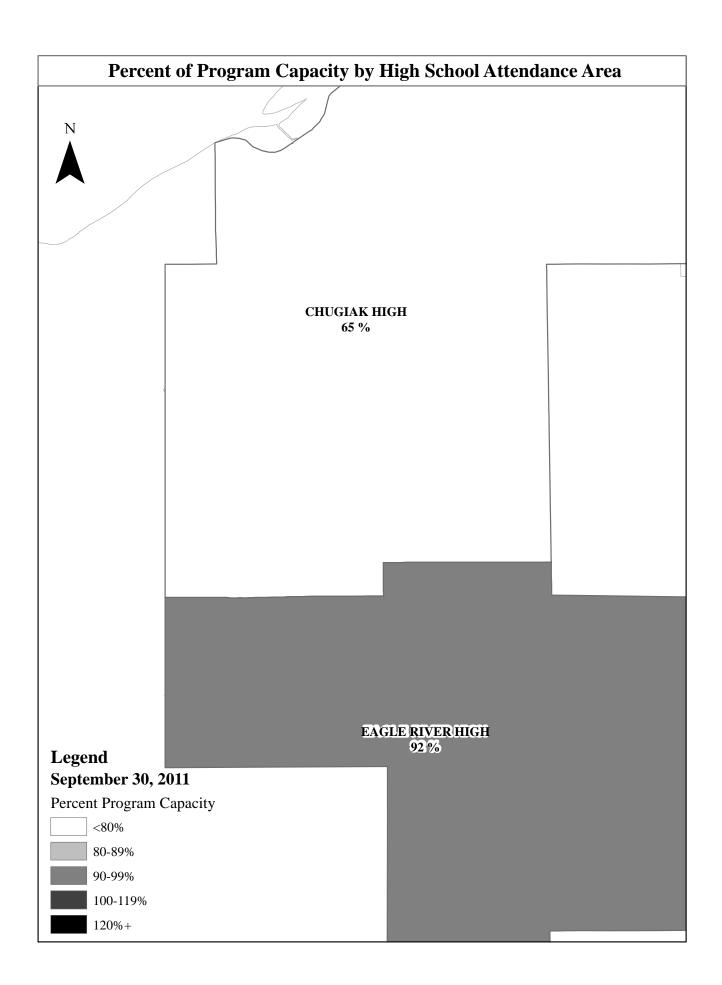












APPENDIX C

Appendix C contains basic information concerning educational space specifications (ed specs) for elementary, middle and senior high schools. These educational specifications were developed following EED guidelines. Since the adoption of these guidelines, EED revised its guidelines from a net square footage to a gross square footage per student calculation. There have been other minor changes in the way that EED calculates allowable space, which is not directly reflected in the following ed specs. Therefore, the overall space allocations and capacity calculations in the following summaries do not reflect the current EED guidelines, though the majority of basic building programs listed are still valid for building new, or remodeling, school spaces.

Rewritten draft educational specifications may replace these space specifications once adopted by the Anchorage School Board. Submission for School Board approval is anticipated to be in 2012.

ELEMENTARY SPACE SPECIFICATIONS

The districtwide Educational Specification document, approved by the board in November 2000, serves as a tool to describe the program and design requirements for any future high school planning in the district. The general space specification for an elementary school is based on projected enrollment of about 550 students in grades K-6. Based upon the State of Alaska Elementary Space Allocation of 106.25 square feet per elementary student, a school will be approximately 58,300 square feet and will be built upon a 15-acre site having no existing infrastructure.

It should be noted that these are preliminary educational space specifications and may change after detailed review of the schematic design.

In addition to the standard elementary school curriculum, this facility will also provide pull out educational programs in resource rooms for main-streamed special education students and students requiring tutorial instruction. The space allocation for schools with additional special education or special services programs utilizing self contained classrooms may be granted an additional square footage allowance with EED approval.

MIDDLE SCHOOL SPACE SPECIFICATIONS

The ASD has updated the space allocation for middle schools. These are space specifications for a middle school with a projected enrollment of 1,058 students in grade 7 - 8. The update is based upon the State of Alaska Secondary Space Allocation of 150 square feet per secondary student. New facilities will be about 158,000 square feet and be built upon a 30-acre site having no existing infrastructure.

The district's allocation recommendation is based on Mirror Lake and Goldenview middle schools. The revised educational specification was approved by the school board in October 2000.

In addition to the standard middle school curriculum, middle schools will also provide educational programs for mainstreamed special education students and students requiring tutorial and special services instruction. The space allocation for schools with additional special education or special services programs utilizing self-contained classrooms may be granted an additional square footage allowance with EED approval.

HIGH SCHOOL SPACE SPECIFICATIONS

The districtwide Educational Specification document, approved by the board in June 1998, serves as a tool to describe the program and design requirements for any future high school planning in the district.

Educational Programs

Anchorage high schools offer comprehensive programs that include a variety of offerings, both required and elective, in the following general-subject areas:

Core Academics (English, math, social studies, world language and science)

Visual arts

Performing Arts (instrumental music, vocal music, drama)

Junior ROTC

Physical education/health

Family and consumer science

Business education/marketing

Technology education

An extensive vocational education program is offered at the King Career Center.

Design Considerations

Several general characteristics must be considered in designing a new high school. The building must be carefully integrated with existing site conditions, nearby neighborhoods and traffic patterns. If the design involves renovation and additions, careful consideration must be given to the existing building to make it contiguous with the planned changes. Site circulation must be designed to safely zone different types of vehicular and pedestrian traffic. Building design must be organized to aid in wayfinding and be easy to supervise and monitor. Ample hallway and common space must be included. It must be possible to separate and secure public-use spaces from other school spaces while providing access to telephone and restroom facilities. Interior lighting must be appropriately provided to meet the needs of each instructional area. Exterior lighting must be balanced to provide safe ingress and egress at all hours. Exterior landscaping should be planned to integrate the existing vegetation, support site circulation, beautify the grounds and provide adequate on-site snow storage, without posing safety hazards. Bus areas and student drop-off/pick-up areas need to be separated from other traffic functions.

Project Parameters

The High School Educational Specification is designed to be flexible to meet the needs of a high school of 1200, 1600, or 2000 students in grades 9 - 12. Additionally, a plan was developed for a 600-student optional high school. The educational specifications can be applicable for future high schools and additions/renovations.

The summary of space requirements for these sizes of schools is based on the State of Alaska Secondary Space Allocation of 150 square feet per student. It is not possible to provide dedicated space for all the functions that occur in a modern high school. To accommodate the need for space, the educational specifications identify basic program space to be provided in all schools. Additional programs can be provided by prioritizing and combining use for the functions listed on the lower section of the Summary of Space chart.

APPENDIX D

SITE SELECTION PROCEDURE

Anchorage is a city characterized by fluctuations in population size, shifting residential settlement patterns and a changing age structure. Due to these factors, planning for the provision of needed school sites and facilities in appropriate geographic locations is critical. The planning process involves the cooperation of many persons and agencies. The ASD works closely with appropriate agencies of the United States Government, the State of Alaska and the Municipality of Anchorage. Private individuals and community groups are also involved in this process, whenever appropriate.

Policy-making bodies involved specifically in the school site selection process are the Anchorage School Board, Planning and Zoning Commission, and the Anchorage Assembly. Staff involved in studying, negotiating terms of sale, and recommending school site selections comes from the school district, its consultants, the municipal Department of Community Planning & Development, and Heritage Land Bank.

Although there are a number of variables that can affect duration of this process, overall site selection, approval and acquisition normally takes six months to one year to complete.

Identification of Needs

The first phase of a school site selection is identification of the need for a school. The school district identifies geographic areas where additional schools will be needed, based on membership projections. These projections are updated yearly, based on historic and current memberships as well as population trends. This is one function of the 10-Year Capital Improvement Plan document.

Site Selection Process

The second phase is site selection. Assembly Ordinance AO No. 2007-124(S) aligns the school site selection and review process with that followed for other public facilities as stipulated in Titles 21.15 and 25.40 of the Municipal Code. The ordinance deferred preparation of detailed implementation procedures to school district and municipal staff.

The process generally involves identifying sites that may accommodate schools, looking at their land status, size, topography, access, utilities infrastructure, surrounding land use, zoning, and other characteristics. On-site exploration is carried out to investigate soils and analyze engineering characteristics. At the same time, site development costs are estimated and appraisals are prepared. The information is summarized in a report presented with recommendations to decision-making bodies.

Site Approval

The third phase of a site selection is the approval process. When the report is available for public distribution, notice is given of public hearing(s) before the school board and the Planning and Zoning Commission. The school board and Planning and Zoning Commission may meet in a joint public hearing; however, they separately consider and make recommendations to the Assembly. Notices are mailed to nearby property owners and advertisements appear in newspapers three weeks prior to the hearing. Notices are also mailed to community councils. Prior to the public hearing, an informational meeting on the site selection is held with area community councils and representatives from the school district and municipal planning staffs. After one or more public hearings, the school board and Planning and Zoning Commission each make recommendations on their preferred site to the assembly for action. The assembly ultimately selects a site for the school through its approval.

Site Acquisition

The final phase of the selection process is acquiring the site. When purchase of a site is necessary, the Real Estate Division of the Municipal Heritage Land Bank obtains a full appraisal and negotiates the purchase of the property. Final terms are subject to approval of the Assembly.

Schedule of Studies

At the development of the 2012-2018 CIP there were no plans for the district to acquire any additional sites.

APPENDIX F

In 2009 the District initiated the development of an asset management system (CPMS) to assist in capital planning. The key component of which is an integrated facility management assessment program (FMAP). Information is collected during facility condition assessments utilizing a systematic and consistent methodology. Educational adequacy assessments determine the ability of a school to meet educational program requirements by evaluating the quantity, configuration, size, and existence of spaces defined by educational specifications. The collected information serves as a basis for determining priorities and costs of facilities' capital needs, and is used for both short term and long term planning purposes.

To date the District with assistance by consultants has completed facility condition assessments on 39 locations and educational adequacy assessment at 35 schools. The assessments on the remaining facilities are expected to be completed by 2013.

Appendix F is a summarization that provides information which describes the current status of those assessed facilities. The 6-Year CIP recommendation, Table 1, was developed by utilizing the Facility Condition Index (FCI), Educational Adequacy Index (EAI) and school's program capacity percentage found in this appendix.
