Your student's most recent English language proficiency assessment indicates that they meet the criteria for the program. Their overall score from this assessment is marked above. Below is information regarding our ELL program's support models. Placement for these courses is based on English proficiency level as determined by the most recent ACCESS test and date of program entry as well as current course performance and student need.

ELL Core Courses: English Language Arts, Algebra 1, Social Studies, Science These courses are intended to provide supportive access to district-adopted grade-level core curricula

ELL Tutorial (High School and some Middle Schools)

These courses are intended to provide structured support to build independence and confidence with classwork from core courses and ensure ELL-related barriers to academic success are addressed

English Language Development Courses: Levels 1-3 (High School and some Middle Schools)

These courses are intended to provide instruction in language acquisition and development and increasing literacy skills to better access core content

- <u>Level 1</u> focuses on increasing ELL students' academic English skills in the areas of Speaking, Listening, Reading, and Writing as measured by the WIDA proficiency levels and providing foundational literacy skills instruction to address the needs of students new to English.
- <u>Level 2</u> focuses on developing ELL students' mastery and application of academic English through structured English Language Development lessons and academic conversations; practice successful scaffolding skills to support students in core content classes
- <u>Level 3</u> focuses on improving writing and grammar skills for the intermediate ELL students; continue to develop communication skills, English language vocabulary, and understanding of grammatical structures

To exit the ELL program, your student must attain proficiency on the annual English language proficiency assessment, <u>ACCESS</u>, given in February. Students who enter the ELL Program at an Entering level and receive consistent ELL support in ASD are predicted to exit the program in 3-5 academic years.

The program exit criteria is set by the AK Department of Education and Early Development (DEED). This year's exit criteria is as follows:

Overall/Composite score of 4.5 or higher
