Field Trip Zangle Reminder

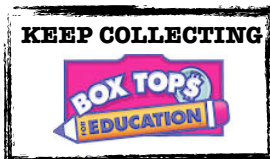

Our students learn skills that make them ready for the 21st century work force and skills they will use in their daily interactions with others.
