

Language Arts Levels E-6

In order to achieve an overall score of “Advanced” for Language Arts Levels E-6, students must:

- Four out of four hits in each category
- Two advanced writing hits
- Two advanced reading hits

In order to achieve an overall score of “Proficient” for Language Arts Levels E-6, students must:

- Four out of four reading and writing hits
- At least three out of four hits on other two standards
- At least three writing hits need to be Proficient

In order to achieve an overall score of “Developing” for Language Arts Levels E-6, and move on to the next level, students must:*

- Three out of four hits on all standards
- At least two out of four writing hits are Proficient
- At least two out of four reading hits are Proficient

*A student CANNOT level up at Developing unless they are a year or more behind.

Strategies for Students Who Are a Year or More Behind

- Students may revise papers from another class to be Proficient for their LA Level
- These students should be put in an additional remedial LA class (this can replace Study Hall)

Strategies for Students Who Are a Year or More Ahead

- At least one AP class should be offered once enough students are eligible (this can replace Study Hall)
