with students to complete weekly homework and they read to or with their children at home. All these supports help our students to grow! Kincaid was among the highest growth for reading in ASD elementary in Kindergarten and First Grade. We are proud of our students, our supportive parents and the instruction our staff provide.

AK Star and Science

2025 AK STAR and Alaska Science Assessment

Each spring, Alaskan students are provided an opportunity to show what they know. When students show what they know, teachers and parents can partner to promote student success. The State of Alaska Department of Education has partnered with NWEA to align and connect the English language arts (ELA) and mathematics tests with the MAP Growth benchmark assessments students take in fall and winter.

This balanced assessment system targets instruction to better support meeting students' individual learning needs. In addition, students will take only one assessment per content area (ELA and math) and be provided two scores as follows:

1. Summative assessment result at grade-level

2. MAP Growth interim benchmark result, including growth from fall to spring AK STAR, the Alaska System of Academic Readiness, is comprised of English language arts and mathematics and is administered to students in grades 3-9. The Alaska Science Assessment is administered to students in grades 5, 8 and 10. The purpose of a large-scale, summative assessment is to provide parents and schools an overall picture of a student's progress in meeting the Alaska standards at grade level.

Parents can locate resources for AK STAR and the Alaska Science Assessment, including directions for Student Readiness (Practice Tests and Tutorials), student testing times and general assessment information on the ASD website at <u>https://www.asdk12.org/akstar</u>.

Parents can also help by ensuring their children are well rested, eat a nutritious breakfast, and are at school on time for the days of testing. Please avoid scheduling appointments on your child's testing days.

The ASD AK STAR and Alaska Science Assessment testing window allows for school assessment scheduling flexibility. Students! Get ready to show what you know during our school's AK STAR and Alaska Science Assessment testing dates:

Emergency Preparedness

What to Expect If Mount Spurr Erupts

- If school is <u>NOT</u> in session and ashfall is imminent, we will close schools.
- If school <u>IS</u> in session and ashfall is imminent, expect early dismissal.

Kincaid Elementary



- We have Identified At-Risk Individuals: We know which students and staff have respiratory conditions and may be especially vulnerable to ash exposure.
- We will control Building Entry: Minimize the number of exterior doors used to minimize ash entering the building.
- We will protect electronics: Power down all computers and electronics if ash is falling—ash can destroy sensitive equipment.
- We will cancel Outdoor Activities: No outdoor recess or unnecessary movement if ash is in the air. Walking and driving can resuspend ash, worsening exposure.
- Students will be provided with twice washable cloth masks

What Are the Most Important Cleanup and Safety Measures

- DO NOT sweep dry ash-it will go airborne. Wet it down first to prevent inhalation risks.
- DO NOT wash ash off roofs—it can cause structural damage due to added weight.
- Personal Preparedness: Families should have 3-5 days of food, water, and medications at home in case of disruptions.
- Protect Vehicles & HVAC Systems: Encourage staff to have spare air filters for their vehicles and homes to prevent damage from ash buildup.

What to Expect for Transportation, Maintenance, and Operations

- Student Transportation:
 - Bus routes may change to avoid hazardous roads.
 - Buses will receive immediate air filter inspections to prevent engine damage.
- Building Maintenance & Air Quality:
 - HVAC exterior vents will be shut down to keep ash from entering buildings.
 - Extra air filters will be available to maintain indoor air quality.
 - Maintenance crews will begin safe ash removal procedures immediately.
