Drills

In order to promote safety at our school we will conduct the following drills this school year in accordance with Anchorage School District policy and procedures.

Fire drills once per month. Dates and times TBD (Fire drills are not pre-announced).

Earthquake drill. Twice per year. October 17 and February 21.

Intruder drill (AKA ALICE): Three per year. September 20, November 5, January 30.

Lockdown: One per year. September 20. Stay Put: One per year. September 20. Shelter in Place (safety team discussion). One per year. September 24.

Remote Learning Plans

Our remote learning plans are designed to ensure that students can continue their education even when they can't physically attend school. 

At CVE we are focusing on improving our students' attendance and I wanted to provide some tips to help make sure student get to school on time, some of which I use in my own life.

- 1. Prepare as much as you can the night before, such as choosing outfits to wear for the next day and having lunch packed and ready to go.
- 2. Make sure your children get to bed early enough so they can have a good night's rest.


