Student enrollment numbers are a bit higher than projected in the spring due to a high student retention rate across all grades. We do have four spots still open in kindergarten which could push our enrollment over 490. It is interesting to note that we have not been able to fill all of our kindergarten spots the last few years. For example, last year, 80 of 88 spots were rostered and this year 68 of 72 spots have been filled so far. This is an interesting trend to follow as enrollment continues to decrease across ASD. We will continue to advertise to the community to fill those remaining kindergarten spots.
