Late Start Mondays and Drop OFF Times/Procedures

Just a reminder that our school start times for the 24-25 school year is a bit different.

Mondays will start later than usual. Drop off begins at 8:40am and the first bell rings at 8:50am. Instruction begins at 9:00am. Student release time will at at 2:30pm.

Tuesdays - Fridays, Drop off begins at 7:40am and the first bell rings at 7:50am. Students enter their classrooms to eat breakfast and get organized. Students are considered tardy after 8:00am. Student release time will remain the same at 2:30pm.

Plan your pick up and drop off routine in advance so students know how they are getting home.

SAFE ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

Arrival

School Drop off and supervision begins at 7:40am (8:40 on Mondays). Please do not drop off students before 7:40 (8:40 on Mondays). Thank you. Students who are not in their classroom by 8am will be marked late.

Thank you for having your students in school on time.

As always, the beginning of the year can be a little hectic during drop off and pick up. Please be patient, flexible, and safe.

- Please do NOT let your students out among the parked cars.
- Wait until you are at the "Drop off and Pick Up Begins Here" sign.
- Please stay in your vehicle and use the drop off and pick up lines.
- Pull all the way forward for drop off and pick up.
- Please do NOT park during drop off and pick up. This is the key to keeping our vehicle line moving.
- The lot is busy and we want to keep all kids safe. Thank you for your help.
- Strive for 7:45 drop off. This is a good rule of thumb.

Dismissal

School dismissal is at 2:30pm. It is a busy and hectic time, especially for a couple of weeks until we get our flow down.

PRO TIP: Feel free to come at 2:25 and avoid the initial traffic jam. :-) Staff will supervise students outside until 2:45pm. At 2:45, students and staff will enter the building and you will need to park and come to the office to pick up your student.

PRO TIP #2: If you have kindergarten or first grade students, PRACTICE getting in and out of your car and seats and belts.

Please be patient, flexible, and safe.

- Please use the pickup line and stay in your vehicle.
- Pull all the way forward to the drop off and pick up sign.
- · Staff will help kids get in and out of vehicles
- Staff will supervise and wave you forward so we can load as many vehicles at a time as
 possible.
- NEVER wave your student into traffic or between parked cars.
- If at all possible, have your student enter and exit your vehicle on the right side out of the way of passing traffic.
- Do NOT block the bus lanes both the entry and the exit
- If you are meeting your student, please wait by the main crosswalk near the road. We will send students to you.

Vision screenings - 9/11/24

Vision screenings will be administered on **9/11/2024** to all preschool and students in grades PK, K, 1, 2, 3, and 5 as required by state law and school district policy.

**Please send your student with glasses or contacts as they will use these during their screenings
**

Why is it important to have your child's vision screened?

If vision problems are not detected and treated early, they can lead to permanent vision loss and learning difficulties. If a child has poor vision, it makes it much harder for them to succeed in school, sports, social situations, and in life.

- Vision problems affect 1 in 20 preschoolers
- 1 in 4 school-age children experience vision problems

Vision screening will consist of one or more of the following:

- 1. Distance visual acuity- ability to see objects far away
- 2. Photo-screening-ability to see far away, up close, and how well the eyes work together
- 3. Binocular vision- how well your child's eyes work together
- 4. Color vision- ability to see colors
- 5. Near visual acuity- ability to see objects up close

How with the results be shared?

- You are welcome to contact the nurse to learn the screening findings.
- If your child does not pass the vision screening, the school nurse will contact you to share the results and may make a recommendation for further evaluation by an eye care specialist

A vision screening provides only a snapshot of how your child performs on the day the test was administered and is not a substitute for a complete eye exam by an optometrist or ophthalmologist.

Hello, Taku families! I am so happy to see both new and "old" faces this year!

For those of you who don't know me, I am Abby Bauer. I am a counselor at Taku and Bayshore Elementary. I will be at Taku every Wednesday (half day 11:30-3), Thursday (all day), and Friday (all day). I hold a MS in Counseling Education, and I have work

experience in healthcare and residential treatment programs. This is my second year as a school counselor. Before joining ASD, I was working in the community as a clinical therapist with teenagers and their families. I am passionate about listening to, talking to, connecting with, and helping families and children of all ages. I am proficient in successful intervention strategies, coping skills, and evaluation techniques.

What is my role?

I am here to help support students, teachers, and parents! I will be visiting classrooms once a month to teach a social emotional learning lesson (SEL). Some topics I cover are self-regulation, managing emotions, empathy, grown mindset, communication, conflict resolution, and more!

I would like the students to think of my office as a safe place, where they are always welcome. I look forward to working with the students and promoting academic, personal, and social development support. I will work with students at the classroom level, small group level, as well as at the short-term individual counseling level. I will also be meeting with parents, collaborating with teachers and staff, and consulting with community organizations to benefit and meet the needs of the students here at Taku.

Individual Counseling

- Both teachers and parents can refer students for individual counseling. Students may also request to see me (I have request forms outside my office door).
- Students might see me for individual counseling to work on decision-making, managing emotions, family dynamics, changes, friendship/social skills, or other concerns.
- You can email me or call me if you would like to refer a student for individual counseling. I
 have a consent form that parents/guardians will need to sign for counseling that extends
 beyond two sessions within a school year or that is planned on a regular basis/as needed. I
 can send students home with the form, e-mail it, or there are paper copies at the front office.

Greetings! We look forward to a new year of nurturing our students' love for reading and lifelong learning, and their competence at navigating and creating in the virtual world. Taku Library offers a full program of activities to support students' development of critical literacy, research, and communication skills.

Curriculum

In the library this month, students will explore the genre, or style of writing, called Realistic Fiction. Realistic Fiction stories address topics such as friendship, family, and school. Students relate easily to these stories, as they present situations that are much like those occurring in students' real lives.



In addition to studying Realistic Fiction, students will also investigate the topic of cyber community citizenship, with lessons tailored to individual grade levels. And, middle grade students will review how to access online resources, including magazine, encyclopedia, and newspaper articles, and ebooks.

Activities

Students in second through fifth grades will have the opportunity to participate in a variety of programs during their recess periods. These activities range from Tech Lab to Recess Read-Aloud to Maker Space. I will send more information about these programs in next month's newsletter.

THE GREAT BODY SHOP

Dear Family Member:

We are delighted to introduce you to <u>THE GREAT BODY SHOP</u>, the comprehensive health education program your child will be participating in this year. THE GREAT BODY SHOP will help your child learn more about the human body and the skills needed to stay safe and healthy. The success of the program requires a team effort, involving you, your child, the teacher, and trusted adults.

This is how it works:

THE GREAT BODY SHOP topics, include nutrition, illness prevention, substance abuse prevention, and safety, among others. Each monthly unit contains information to help your child understand his or her own body, the way it works, and the best ways to keep it healthy and — safe. The teacher will discuss each monthly unit of THE GREAT BODY SHOP with students and guide them in developmentally appropriate, skill-based activities to reinforce the lessons contained in each unit.

To support families in taking an active roles in their child's health education, we provide digital copies of the Student Issues, Family Bulletins, the Family Connections newsletters, and The Great Body Shop music in the Family Portal.
